



## **School Nurse Roles**

- Identify students with acute/chronic medical disorders (diabetes, epilepsy, asthma, food allergies, etc.) and mental health concerns; coordinate care with staff/physicians//FRC/counselor/community resources/teachers/parents; create Individualized Health Care plans; parent education on communicable disease protocols/COVID
- o Immunization compliance per AZDHS standards, student referrals, documentation, AZDHS annual reporting
- Mandated hearing/vision screening per AZDHS standards, student referrals, documentation, AZDHS annual reporting
- Special Education Support: IEP's, 504 plans, OT, PT, medicaid billing
- Daily health services for students/staff: provide safe environment, wellness assessments, medication administration, concerns with personal hygiene/hunger/clothing needs/housing needs, emergency drill preparedness, provide staff training (medication administration procedures, emergency response team, field trips)
- PUSD nurses meet monthly to collaborate, continued education classes, keep all certifications up to date, National Association of School Nurse members, JeanMarie recently chosen as a mentor for the Arizona School Nurse Access Program
- Upkeep of medical equipment (AED, audiometers, PlusOptix), Over The Counter Medications and first aid supplies

#### Types of Incidents:

- Non-Emergency: minor injury/illness (abrasions, lacerations, nosebleeds, headaches, stomachaches, menstrual issues, burns, daily medication, as needed medications, eye injury, insect bites), mental health (anxiety/panic attacks/behavioral), student altercations, wound care, change of clothes
- Emergency: Major injury/illness, life threatening allergic reactions, severe asthma attacks, diabetic emergencies, orthopedic injuries, seizures, suspected intoxication/drug overdose, child neglect/abuse






