HELP PUSD SCHOOL STAFF MAY BE ABLE TO GIVE

PUSD Homeless Program:

The Federal definition of homelessness for school districts is broad and includes students living in <u>temporary situations</u> <u>due to economic hardship or loss of housing</u>, including living in motels, shelters, campgrounds, substandard housing, or doubled up in someone else's home.

If a student is in any of these situations, their parent/guardian can fill out a PUSD homeless application. The front desk at school can give them an application or direct them to the Site Homeless Liaison.

The PUSD Homeless Program <u>does not offer housing</u>, but may be able to provide additional school-based services to help students be prepared for and thrive in school.
